

2023 IN BRIEF

2023 was an exciting year, we completed the park district's very first comprehensive master plan, in which we spent a year gathering feedback and input from the community to help steer the future of the Park District. We know the community is looking for diverse opportunities to explore our spaces, whether its trails, waterways, or being emerged into nature; they want an adventure. The master plan will be the guiding tool to make those visions a reality, as we continue to improve our lands and grow the public's opportunities. In 2023, we broke ground on our newest addition to our portfolio, Ten Mile Creek Preserve. We upgraded facilities such as the historic Chilo Lock 34 museum, Pattison Lodge, and the popular Osage Orange disc golf course. Sycamore Park became home to our first set of pickle ball courts, as we updated signage and new trail maps. A new shelter at Kathryn Stagge Marr Park completes the rebuild that began in 2022 after the tornado struck the Goshen community. New bridges at both Shor and Clingman parks provide access and extend trail opportunities. Last but certainly not least, we honored former Executive Director Chris Clingman for his years of service and countless accomplishments, by naming our newest park and home of our administrative offices after him, congrats Chris, well deserved!











ANNUAL REVENUE



ANNUAL EXPENSES


